G. Fire Chief's Report

Chief Schuldt presented report as submitted and added the following:

- Brush truck 71 (B71) is in the final stages of be readied for service. Once the equipment has been mounted, factory and District training will be provided. Push back is scheduled for May 20th @ 5:30pm at station 71. The GAC Land Trust partnered with GNFD and matched \$106,362.72 for Brush 71 and will be in attendance at the ceremony.
- The 2018 Annual Report is complete and has been electronically distributed.

- As a result of working with Local 2396 on staffing issues, we are moving forward with the process of adding 3 more Lieutenants per shift; bringing the total number per shift to 17. We will be promoting from Driver Engineers and will backfill that position. The cost of the promotions outweighs the overtime savings.
- Commissioner Page questioned if Ten-8 and Cummings ever tested the pump on LA72. Schuldt- GNFD decided to test the pump because of the amount of work that had taken place. The unit did not initially pass, but after an in house repair passed.
- Commissioner Gerrity asked if the 3 trucks that are having corrosive issues are all Pierce. Schuldt- Yes. Gerrity -Does Pierce understands our displeasure with this? Schuldt- Yes, it is an ongoing issue and Staff is discussing how to proceed.
- Chief Schuldt reviewed Memorandum 19-027 regarding changes at the Command Staff level. In an effort to enhance management effectiveness and accountability of operational aspects of the organization, Deputy Chief Martin shall serve as the Chief Operating Officer. Assistant Chief Sapp and Deputy Chief Martin will report to, and coordinate all activities accordingly. Battalion Chief Caleb Morris title changed from Battalion Chief to Division Chief.
- Page- Where are we with ALS position? Schuldt It has been included in the budget the last 2 years. Previous labor management didn't support and several months ago the Board gave direction that no additional Chief Officers would be added without Board approval. Page Is the position funded? Schuldt Yes. Gerrity We are already over budget at this point and going into spending reserves, therefore it might be a good time to be prudent. Chairman Henning asked for minutes reflecting Board's direction that no new Chief Officers be added without the Board's approval.
- Senate Bill 426 sponsored by Senator Flores was signed by the Governor on 5/3/19. Effective 7/1/19, this law grants certain benefits to a firefighter upon receiving a diagnosis of cancer if certain conditions are met; this will have financial implication on the District.

I. Local 2396 Report - President Kevin Nelmes

- Florida Professional Firefighters (FPF) are mindful of the unknown financial impact the passing of Bill 426 will have. Thanks to E. Gill, K. King. J. Taylor, and B. Mading for their efforts and commitment to getting the Bill passed.
- Union members and Scott Hogan have been working with Director Bishop to finalize a Chapter 175 DROP Plan.
- Lt. Grimm asked for assistance in going over the many documents presented at the GDC meetings. Forward process is being made to improve efficiency and safety as well as labor management relations.
- FF Morales and Lt. Nelmes have completed Zoll training with CC EMS.

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- Inspector Mading and Chief Low continue work on the PTSD training module.

ACTIVITIES REPORT

<u>Government Technologies Award</u> – May 9; The District was nominated for a Special District Technology Innovation award for the recent adoption of the Knox Rapid Access Key program. Because of the District's accomplishments I was selected to represent the organization on the Government Technology Special Districts Program, National Advisory Board.

<u>Greater Naples Fire Rescue Firefighters Pension Plan Meeting</u> – May 10; Director Bishop and I attended the Quarterly Plan meeting. Among the items, the Board discussed progress on the DROP previously approved by the Board of Fire Commissioners. To date, it cannot be confirmed that the Pension Board had provided the District with the final draft DROP document meeting the desire and direction of the Board of Fire Commissioners.</u>

May 23; Director Bishop and I met with Union and Pension Board leadership to discuss a path to move the Pension DROP forward. President Nelmes and Trustee Hogan discussed "how we got here" and intentions to move forward and finalize language in support of all parties' interest. My understanding is the Pension Board would have the plan document updated and DROP language finalized in a fashion to support the Board's direction.

<u>Labor Negotiations</u> - May 30; The District and Union to formally negotiate the Pension Plan DROP. Article language was exchanged and further negotiations will be necessary.

June 5; District staff participated in a labor negotiations workshop to work through the remaining Articles. It is anticipated an executive session will be appropriate in the near future to update the Board and receive further direction.

<u>Personnel</u> – The Logistics Administrative Assistant position remains vacant. A previous employment offer was made including background and medical reviews completed. Applicant withdrew days before the assigned start date.

Currently, the Operations Section has eight firefighters off work on extended leave due to Workers Compensation, FMLA, or Military leave.

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<u>Florida Cancer Presumption Bill</u> – Staff is working with current and prospective insurance carriers to secure the required coverages as outlined in State Statute. As presented during the April Board meeting, the District is responsible to provide specific benefits to firefighters diagnosed with 21 types of cancer.

<u>District Reorganization</u> – As explained during the April Board meeting a number of administrative changes were implemented, specifically the Operations (Sapp) and Logistics (McLaughlin) Sections are reporting to Deputy Chief Martin. Numerous on-going programs are being evaluated, reprioritized, and closely monitored for process improvements.

Knox Key Secure Program - Key Secure boxes have been installed in all front-line apparatus. Through the existing partnership agreement, Knox is taking steps to upgrade the District's inventory of Key Secure devices to the most recent version. Staff will be bringing this item to the June Board meeting for approval.

<u>Countywide Operational Guidelines</u> – As previously reported; in mid-2018, District staff presented a case to the Collier County Fire Chiefs to conduct a review of all existing countywide operational procedures, and reach agreement to reaffirm, or update the documents to better unify critical operations during inter-agency responses by January 2019.

Currently the Countywide chiefs have yet to adopt said guidelines, and as a result District staff began an effort to author a number of policies to enhance operations. District staff has implemented (or reaffirmed) several new/existing operational guidelines. When possible, staff utilized previously adopted or countywide best-practices documents to develop District guidelines. There are currently a number of documents under development, review or recently adopted.

<u>Curlew Fire Review</u> - May 22; The District held the formal Post Incident Analysis under the facilitation of the State Fire Marshal's Office. The session was captured on video and will be posted, along with the report on the District's training platform in order all employees have access to the information.

<u>Closest Unit Response</u> – The communications center continues to implement changes to the closest unit response program. As part of the effort to reduce unnecessary movement of apparatus, maintain appropriate zone coverage, and limit exposure to potential accidents during emergency response, a number of incident types have been modified (reduced). Most notably are incident types for the battalion chiefs, reducing responses outside the District's geographical boundaries, and responses to activated fire alarms with no report of fire.

<u>Alligator Alley Fire Station</u> – The Governor has not signed HB 2044 providing for funding of the public safety facility. There remain three possible outcomes:

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- 1. Governor signs Becomes law
- 2. Governor vetoes Bill dies
- 3. Governor fails to sign Bill becomes law

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<u>Employee Recognition</u> – May 20; 30 members of the District were recognized during the Collier County Phoenix Awards Ceremony. May 26; Lieutenant Nelmes was recognized as the Florida State Elks public safety responder of the year during their annual state meeting in Orlando. May 24; two members graduated from the Hodges Paramedic program. I was honored to speak as part of the commencement ceremony.

<u>Public Speaking Events</u> – The District presented a number of topics at various meetings over recent weeks; International Men's Club – District overview and merger accomplishments; VeronaWalk – Hurricane preparedness; Naples Reserve – Community Emergency Response Team.

<u>Station 21 Generator</u> – The District recently received notification of preliminary award from the Florida Division of Emergency Management/FEMA for the generator project previously applied for. The District is currently conducting the required Public Comment period. Once expired the grant should be formally awarded.

<u>EMS Stations</u> – Collier County EMS recently notified the District of their new target date of July, 2019 for groundbreaking of the Lord's Way facility. CCEMS also informed staff of their intention to purchase a five-acre parcel in the area of Golden Gate Blvd. and DeSoto with the intention of building a new facility in the near future (after Station 25). Chief Butcher inquired as to our interest to jointly staff the facility. It was explained the Board previously provided verbal direction to consider future facilities as prioritized; (1) Lord's Way, (2) Lake Park, (3) Golden Gate Estates. With that considered the District will continue to work in cooperation with CCEMS and the CCSO to jointly construct and staff future facilities in effort to reduce construction and operating costs.

<u>Congressman Diaz-Balart</u> - May 29; the Chairman and I met with Congressman Diaz-Balart to discuss Federal funding possibility for the Ochopee Fire District. Several areas of discussion including PILT, FEMA, CDBG, and HUD were vetted. The Congressman was very considerate of our position and offered his staff to continue working on new avenues moving forward.

<u>Ochopee Interlocal Agreement</u> - District and County staff have met several times to draft a new agreement prior to the October, 2019. The District has expressed its desire to closely align the terms to the FDOT agreement. Also requested is a replacement plan for several fire apparatus currently owned by the County and due for replacement. The draft Agreement has been returned to the County for their review and acceptance. Once returned, it will be moved to the District's Board for consideration.

<u>Training</u> – District personnel have recently participated in a number of training events including Zoll cardiac monitor, new brush truck orientation, LSU hazardous materials, and EMS ambulance orientation and District Physician in-service training events, for example.

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<u>Marco Island Fleet Agreement</u> – District and City staff have finalized a new draft agreement that better outlines financial schedule and administrative requirements of all parties. The draft document is currently with Marco Island staff for consideration and Council approval. Once accepted the Agreement will be presented to the District Board for consideration.

<u>Hurricane Season Preparation</u> – Staff recently initiated hurricane planning efforts for this year's season. A review of the existing plan has been conducted with several recommendations for additional preparatory supplies, and vendor agreements/confirmation.

<u>ISO Public Protection Classification Survey</u> – June 5; The District received a new PPC Classification of 4/10. This is a retrogression from the previous classification of 3/10 (East Naples and Golden Gate). A complete review of the survey will be conducted by staff to assess the findings. This will be presented to the Board in the near future.

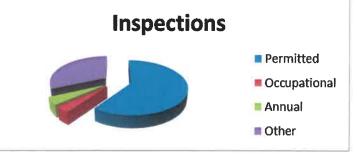

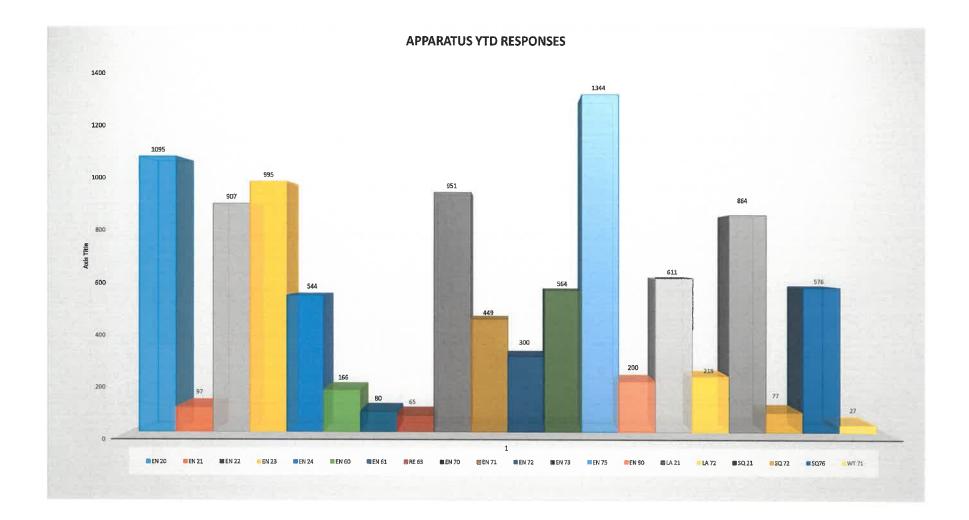

Background

In February of 2018, with Board of Fire Commissioner approval, the Greater Naples Fire Rescue District (District) entered into an agreement with the Knox Company for the purpose of transitioning to the Knox line of products, providing District stakeholders with a UL Listed product line allowing for code compliance options not previously available from other vendors and offered a stronger accountability/tracking system through the utilization of the Knox KeySecure units. Since implementation of this program, the upgraded KeySecure units completed beta testing and have been shipped to the District in exchange for the units provided at the time of the previous agreement.

The advantages of the upgraded KeySecure units are they are an electronic and mechanical system solution that provides an enhanced level of security by allowing the ability to deactivate the electronic key at any time, provides a cloud-based audit trail of key access and lock box openings, and provides for advanced key configuration options and collaborative opportunities.

A similar agreement has been offered to the other Collier County fire departments, thereby assisting efforts to establish a single lock box key solution Countywide.

Funding Source/Financial Impact

The financial impact to the District would not exceed the original BOFC approved agreement. The financial impact would not be realized until FY2020-2021 with the opportunity to be reduced or cost neutral. The maximum financial impact is \$32,435.

Recommendation

Staff's recommendation is to proceed with the updated terms within the Knox correspondence dated June 7, 2019 and move forward with accepting the enhanced Knox KeySecure units to be utilized in frontline apparatus and support vehicles.

Potential Motion

"I move to support Staff's recommendation and make a motion to accept the upgraded KeySecure units and terms as noted in the June 7, 2019 Knox correspondence, thereby enhancing the professional service options provided to the Greater Naples community.

Background

The Greater Naples Fire Rescue District has been awarded a FEMA grant through the Florida Fire Management Assistance Grant 5178-14. Its purpose is to provide a generator for the Public Safety Facility located at 11121 East Tamiami Trail (Station 21).

During the February 2018 Board meeting, the Commissioner's authorized the District to move forward and apply for The Florida Fire Assistance Grant.

The grant has been awarded in the amount of \$72,386.25 to provide a facility emergency generator to include installation and site work. The Generator will power the entire facility including Fire, EMS and the Sheriff substation.

The Fire Management Assistance Grant will provide for 75 % funding (\$72,386.25). The District is responsible for a 25% match (\$24,128.75).

With known planning, permitting, bid process, and work schedule timing it is expected the work will be completed first quarter of FY 19-20; therefore, funding would be from the General Fund, Capital Building and Improvements line item.

Funding Source/Financial Impact

The funding source will be the General Fund, FY 19-20 Capital Outlay.

Recommendation

Staff recommends accepting the Fire Management Assistance Grant for the purposes of purchasing and installing a new generator for the Station 21 Public Safety Facility.

EXTENSION AND AMENDMENT AGREEMENT TO INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT FOR FIRE AND RESCUE SERVICES BY AND BETWEEN COLLIER COUNTY AND GREATER NAPLES FIRE RESCUE DISTRICT

This Extension and Amendment Agreement is entered into this 9th day of July, 2019, to the Interlocal Agreement for Fire and Rescue Services dated September 13, 2016 by and between the Board of County Commissioners of Collier County, Florida, a political subdivision of the State of Florida (hereinafter referred to as the "County"), and the Greater Naples Fire Rescue District, an Independent Special District created under Chapter 2014-240, Laws of Florida, and operated pursuant to Chapter 191, Florida Statutes (hereinafter referred to as "Greater Naples").

WHEREAS, the Interlocal Agreement for Fire and Rescue Services dated September 13, 2016 between the parties (hereinafter referred to as the "Interlocal Agreement") is scheduled to terminate September 30, 2019; and

WHEREAS, the parties remain committed to consolidating the Ochopee Fire Control District into Greater Naples, which requires appropriate action by the Florida Legislature and approval at referendum of the qualified electors within the Ochopee Fire Control District; and

WHEREAS, the parties desire continuation of the services being provided by Greater Naples on behalf of the County to manage the Ochopee Fire Control District until action is taken by Greater Naples to pursue annexation through the Florida Legislature and subsequent approval at referendum of said qualified electors.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

1. The Interlocal Agreement is hereby extended and will terminate on September 30, 2020 or upon execution of a successor Agreement.

2. In accordance with the FDOT agreement for funding Station 63 (Alligator Alley), Collier County will provide one firefighter paramedic to staff the station 24 hours, 7 days a week. Collier County will invoice Greater Naples for the salary and benefits; up to the budgeted line item amount as stated in the FDOT agreement associated with this service with backup documentation sufficient to support Greater Naples in requesting FDOT reimbursement. The County will be responsible for any Collier County firefighter paramedic line item expense overages.

3. Except as modified above by this Extension and Amendment Agreement, all other terms and conditions of the Interlocal Agreement shall remain in full force and effect. If there is a conflict between the terms of this Extension and Amendment Agreement and the Interlocal Agreement, the terms of this Extension and Amendment Agreement shall prevail.

Background

This is a request for a new ballistic armor program purchase. In light of recent Active Shooter Hostile Event Responses (ASHER), the District wishes to protect our employees, to the best of our ability for these situations. Equipment will be aligned with NFPA Standard 3000, written with firefighter safety at the forefront. The goal is to have protective armor for each seat of the apparatus that will respond.

Per Purchasing Policy 902.1; the individual set price makes the purchase a Category 1, allowing for Finance Director approval. However, the collective purchase price makes the purchase a Category 3; requiring formal competitive sealed bids, competitive proposals or competitive selection and negotiations with the purchase being awarded by the Board of Fire Commissioners.

Funding Source/Financial Impact

Purchase not to exceed amount of \$50,000. \$25,000 budgeted from General Fund-Uniforms, and \$25,000 Impact Fees, to be released from Impact Fee reserves. After consultation with legal, the enhancement to our Rescue services with the addition of ballistic gear, qualifies for the partial use of Impact Fee funds to fund the project.

Recommendation

Staff seeks board approval to move forward with the purchase of the ballistic gear, not to exceed \$50,000 from Channel Innovations.

NIJ CERTIFICATION

SELECTING A PROTECTION LEVEL

The National Institute of Justice is the government agency responsible for establishing certification and protection standards for body armor. Phalanx Defense Systems armor undergoes routine testing at an NIJ approved laboratory, allowing us to guarantee its protection against specific threats. Below are the classifications, but note that Phalanx does not make armor that is below Level IIIA.

LEVEL IIA Tested to stop 9mm and .40 S&W ammunition fired from short barrel handguns. No rifle ammunition protection.

LEVEL II Tested to stop 9mm and .357 Magnum ammunition fired from short barrel handges. No rifle ammunition protection.

LEVEL IIIA Tested to stop .357 SIG and .44 Magnum ammunition fired from longer barrel pandguns. No rifle ammunition protection.

LEVEL III Tested to stop 7.62 FMJ (full metal jacket) lead core rifle ammunition.

LEVEL IV Tested to stop .30 cal steel core armor piercing rifle ammunition.

Background

The current ALS Coordinating officer has been a temporary assignment and it is necessary to make a formal appointment and transition to Division Chief. The individual appointed to the ALS Coordinating Officer is a non-exempt position under the provisions of the Fair Labor Standards Act, serves at the rank of Lieutenant and currently reports to the Deputy Chief of Training.

Because the current position is non-exempt there remain a number of limitations inhibiting maximum program impact. An exempt classification will enhance program effectiveness in a number of areas including, but not limiting to; infection control, HIPAA compliance, and continuous quality improvement programs, all of which involve confidential patient and emergency services worker related information where an exempt employee is best suited to address.

The current ALS Coordinating Officer non-exempt classification limits the District's ability to deploy a medical officer after regular work hours. This significantly diminishes the District's ability to provide dedicated staff support to incidents involving infection control or other situations when a medical care specialist is needed to interact with hospitals and doctors under confidential circumstances. There are additional occasions where staff support is necessary to secure critical medical supplies and equipment after regular working hours.

It is also appropriate to have an EMS Chief Officer representing the Fire Chief and District during executive-level meetings with area hospitals, County Emergency Medical Services management staff, County Medical Director, District Physician, and community groups such as the Emergency Medical Authority for example.
