

Our Marine Emergency Response Team (MERT) recently completed the Boat Operator Search and Rescue (BOSAR) course with the U.S. Coast Guard on Fort Myers Beach. This inter-agency training focused on advanced water rescue and search & rescue operations.

Our team is now certified to assist in searches without the Coast Guard having to review our procedures.

The course is NASBLA-approved, meaning it meets national boating safety standards and provides the knowledge needed to operate safely and effectively on the water.
